We are particularly interested in individuals whose work complements and strengthens the research interests of MSU faculty, including those focused on neurology, developmental biology, immunology, microbial physiology and ecology, molecular evolution, virology, biomedical microbiology, environmental health, structural biology, and host-pathogen interactions. The Department of Microbiology & Cell Biology offers a dynamic research and teaching environment with state-of-the-art facilities for infectious disease (e.g., BSL3), flow cytometry, light and cryo-electron microscopy, histology, and small and large animal research. The University supports comprehensive cores in metabolomics, proteomics, imaging, structural biology, and genomics/bioinformatics.
