We write to request your assistance in identifying strong candidates for two tenure-track positions for Assistant or Associate Professor in the Department of Immunobiology at Yale University School of Medicine. Qualified individuals in all areas of immunology are invited to apply and should have a Ph.D. and/or M.D. and an excellent track record of publications. One of the positions will be in the department's Section of Human and Translational Immunology, and the successful applicant for that position should be focused on studies of the human immune system. We are particularly interested in candidates whose research interests complement those of the existing faculty (<http://immunobiology.yale.edu>). Strong candidates will have a clear vision for developing an independent research program and enthusiasm for participating in trainee mentoring, teaching, and departmental activities. We strongly encourage applications from individuals in groups identified by the NIH as historically underrepresented in STEM. These include Women, Blacks or African Americans, Hispanics or Latinos, American Indians or Alaska Natives, Native Hawaiians and other Pacific Islanders, persons with disabilities and individuals from disadvantaged backgrounds.
